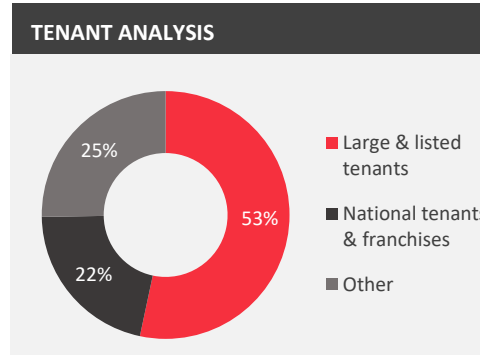
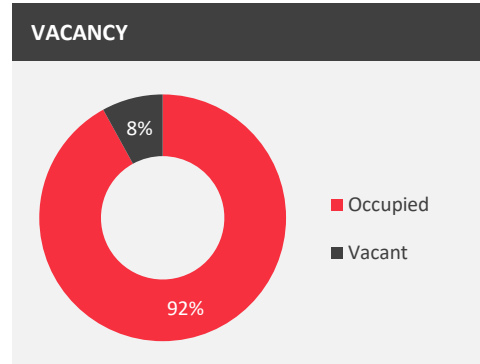

LOCATION

Gateway Mall is situated on Osmium road which is the main road running through Carletonville.

DESIGN

Gateway Mall is an inward facing centre comprising of a single storey retail centre with mezzanine offices on the north-west section.

ACCESS

Gateway Mall is easily accessible from the main road running through Carletonville, on foot from the surrounding residential area and from the on-site taxi rank.

TENANT MIX

National tenants account for approximately 75% of the occupied gross lettable area. The centre is anchored by a Shoprite store. Other national tenants include Pep, African Bank, Capitec Bank, Standard Bank, FNB, Skipper Bar, Studio 88, Beaver Canoe, Ideals, Rage, Legit, Pep Cell, OK Furniture, and KFC.

RENEWABLE ENERGY

Capital Land actively identifies opportunities for solar projects and is committed to increasing the percentage of renewable energy in the portfolio under management. The Gateway Mall solar project was completed in March 2020.

- **Energy generation:** 797 732 kWh per year
